Bomb-Making Materials Awareness: Your Role (AWR-911)

The **Bomb-Making Materials Awareness: Your Role** course uses an immersive, graphic novel style storytelling approach to educate and empower community members on how to identify and report suspicious activity and purchasing behaviors related to bomb-making materials.



Course Format and Audience

This 40-minute independent study training (IST) is a self-paced, web-based course covering:

- The role the general public, private sector, public safety personnel, and fusion centers have in recognizing and reporting suspicious incidents related to bomb-making
- Indicators of suspicious activities and purchasing behaviors
- How to report a suspicious incident

This course is designed for all community members interested in preventing bombing incidents. Participants may come from various backgrounds, including:

- General public
- Private Sector
- Public safety dispatchers
- Law enforcement
- Fire and emergency medical technicians



Accreditation
