- Provides reporting mechanisms to track and measure success

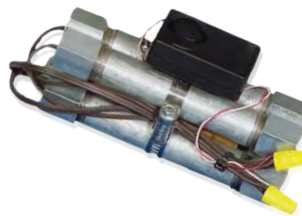
BOMBS CAN BE MADE WITH EVERYDAY PRODUCTS
